David Maxwell Mercer was born in Bay Roberts on January 15, 1943. He was the eldest of seven children born to Lorraine and Maxwell Mercer of Bay Roberts, NL.

He attended the Amalgamated School in Bay Roberts and graduated in 1961. While attending school he joined the Army Cadets and went to Nova Scotia each summer for training.

David moved to St. John's in 1962 and met Marguerite (Peg) Butler, who would become his best friend and life partner when they married in 1968.

David worked at Stokes Construction for a period of time. In 1963 he went to work at the General Hospital until December 1965 when he then joined the Royal Newfoundland Constabulary. David spent 25 years working in different departments of the Constabulary retiring with the rank of Sergeant in 1988. In 1986 he received the Police Exemplary Service Medal from the Lt. Governor on behalf of the Governor General of Canada.



In 2013 David joined the Royal Canadian Legion Branch 56 and enjoyed the time he spent there.

After retirement he became a Member of the Police Veterans Association and served as Secretary for 5 years and remained an active member until his passing.

David passed away September 5, 2017, at the age of 74.
