Edward enlisted in the Royal Newfoundland Regiment on May 22nd, 1918. He was 24 at the time.

Edward's service covers the period from May 22, 1918, to June 26, 1919, 13 months in all. His documented service is as follows:

1. Embarked St. John's on the S.S. Columbella to Halifax 22 July 1918
2. Embarked for Britain 22 July 1918
3. Disembarked France 25 November 1918
4. Joined the British Expeditionary Force 5 January 1919
5. Transferred to Rouen Camps (France) 22 April 1919
6. Arrived at Westminster, South Hampton 23 April 1919

7. Reported to Hazeley Down Camp (England) 30 April 1919
8. To Newfoundland for demobilization 22 May 1919
9. Arrived Newfoundland 1 June 1919.
10. Officially demobilized 10 July 1919.

One a note of interest: Edward's medical upon discharge contains the notation that "he complains of no disability"

After his discharge, Edward returned to his former occupation as a fisherman.

The 1921 Newfoundland general census finds him married to Annie Mildred (nee Mercer); both are twenty-seven (27) years old. His mother, Harriet is now a widow, and she is living with her son Thos. (an abbreviation for Thomas) and his wife Fannie.

Edward appears in the 1935 census at age 40 married to a lady by the name of Clara (30), having lost his first wife in November 1930. Clara and Edward have a family of 7 in all, which includes 3 stepchildren of Clara, two (2) from Edward's previous marriage and two (2) from their union.

By 1945, Edward, now 51 and Clara 41 have increased their family by another 4 children. There are now 7 living at home with them.

Edward passed away in May 1955 at the age of sixty-one (61). He is buried in the United Church Cemetery at Bay Roberts.

Here is a copy of his obituary from the Daily News:

Mercer - Passed peacefully away on Tuesday, May 17th, Mr. Edwin G. Mercer, aged 60 years, a resident of Mercer's Cove, Bay Roberts.

Left to mourn their sad loss, are his widow, five sons, Eugene in Toronto, Tom with the R.C.A.F. in Quebec, John, David, Ray at Bay Roberts; five daughters, Lillian in Corner Brook, Carrie in Beverly, U.S., Doris in Cavendish, Ida and Patricia at home; one step-son, Robert Badcock, with the U.S.A.F. in Japan; two step-daughters, Vera and Phyllis in Beverly, U.S.; two brothers, John B.

Mercer and Eugene Mercer, both residing at Bay Roberts.

The late Mr. Mercer was a veteran of the First World War who served in the Army. While not being very active of late, he was nevertheless, not feeling too well of late.

The funeral took place on Thursday, May 19th, to

the United Church and Cemetery, Bay Roberts, with the minister, Rev. J. S. H. Moran, B.A., officiating. In attendance were members of the Bay Roberts Branch Canadian Legion with a Guard of Honour, Firing Party, and bugler from the C.L.B. Deepest sympathy is extended to the bereaved family.

Descriptive Return of a Soldier Discharged on Account of Disability

INSTRUCTIONS—This form is to be completed in the case of every discharged soldier whose claim to pension, on account of disability, is to be submitted for the consideration of the Pensions and Disabilities Board.

This section should be completed in the Hospital at which a man is attending at the time of his examination by a Medical Board, or, if the man is not in Hospital, by the Medical Officer of the Unit or Command Depot. The Soldier should be given a full opportunity of examining it, as, if awarded a pension, his subsequent identification depends on his confirming this declaration. The "Rank," "Station" and "Date" should be in his own handwriting.

The form will then be attached to the Proceedings of the man's Medical Board and will be forwarded to the O. i. c. Records together with the remainder of the man's documents.

Changes occurring in the description subsequent to the date of admission to pension should be noted in red ink.
