

Born on September 20<sup>th</sup>, 1924, Ernest Wilson Snow was the third son to arrive in the family of James and Winnie Snow. He was the third boy in 4 four years for the Snows.

Ernest was the youngest of first three boys who served in various capacities in World War 2.

During WW2, Ernest would serve in the capacity with the Merchant Navy. This following his father who had served as a seaman in WW1 and now once again was serving but this time in the Merchant Navy.

Whether or not father and son served together is unclear but is a testament to the family that father and his three boys were all involved in the war effort.

It has been said that service in the Merchant Navy was more dangerous than service in the Navy itself. Being on the water with little armament brought more than its share of potential dangers.

Ernest, like all Snow family members survived the war and returned to civilian life following its conclusion.

Ernest would marry Phyllis in 1951 and together they would live their lives in Bay Roberts.

Ernest passed away in 2009 and is buried in the Central United Church Cemetery, Bay Roberts.
