

Isaac Richards World War I Royal Naval Reserve (Newfoundland) Service No. 627X




Isaac enlisted sometime in the summer of 1914. His service ledger record contains the following entries by date:

Following his service during World War I, the 1921 census shows him living at home in Bareneed, Newfoundland with his widowed mother Mary and his younger brother Samuel. Isaac is 30 years old.

The next general Newfoundland census of 1935 has him still living at home with his mother (74) and working at farm work. Isaac who is now 45 is married to a lady named Elizabeth, she is four years his junior.

By 1945, they are still in Bareneed. There are no children.
