In the summer of 1914, Samuel enlisted in the Royal Naval Reserve (Newfoundland) at the Port St. John's and began his training in October of that year.

From his Service Ledger Record the following entries provide dates, place and ships to which he was assigned. His service record covers the period from Oct 1914 to Apr 1919, a four and half year period (4 1/2).

Following release from service, Samuel who is now 28 years old is found in the 1921 Newfoundland general census living in Bay Roberts. He is married and him and his wife Violet have an eleven (11) month old child, Mildred.

An entry in the 1935 census listings, show the family has now grown to include two more children, both girls.

The 1945 census contains Samuel (51), and Violet (51) are still living in Bay Roberts but now with just two of their three children living at home with them.

Samuel Passed away in 1974 and Violet in 1977. They are buried in St. Mark's Anglican Cemetery at Shearstown.
