Wilfred joined the Royal Naval Reserves (Newfoundland) in early 1940. The fact that he was part of the 5th Naval Contingent to ship overseas on the 7th of March 1940 gives credence to this assumption.

Specific and factual information regarding Wilfred has been difficult to find but several dated newspaper clippings do provide some information. These clippings help with the timeline of some of his wartime service and are provided in chronological order as follows:

Gifts of money and comforts were presented to each of the boys by Mrs. (Rev.) Reynolds, Vice-Pres. of the W.P.A., who spoke in very high terms of our noble boys who are risking their all for us, to which the boys ably responded.

Refrshments were then served to which all present took part and thoroughly enjoyed the gathering. The music for the evening was kindly rendered by Mrs. Bert Hillyard.

A most enjoyable evening was brought to a close with the singing of The National Anthem.

HOME ON LEAVE

Petty Officer Wilfred Parsons, R.N., arrived home recently to spend a brief furlough with relatives and friends at Shearstown. He will be returning to duty within a few days, and expects to be going to the Pacific.

Following the end of the war, it appears that Wilfred continued his service as part of the Royal Navy.

There is record of him having served on the HMS Childers, (see the picture and information below),



HMS Childers

"HMS Childers was one of thirty-two C-class destroyers built for the Royal Navy during the Second World War, a member of the eight-ship Ch sub-class. Commissioned in 1945, she was built as a flotilla leader with additional accommodation for staff officers."

Wilfred died on 05 May 1952, and is buried at North Front Cemetery in Gibraltar. His home base is listed as HMS Rooke, Gibraltar. His name is recorded on the Military Honour Roll 1945-2022.
